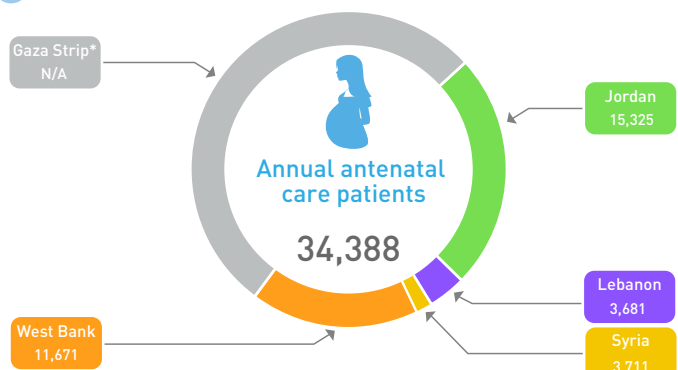




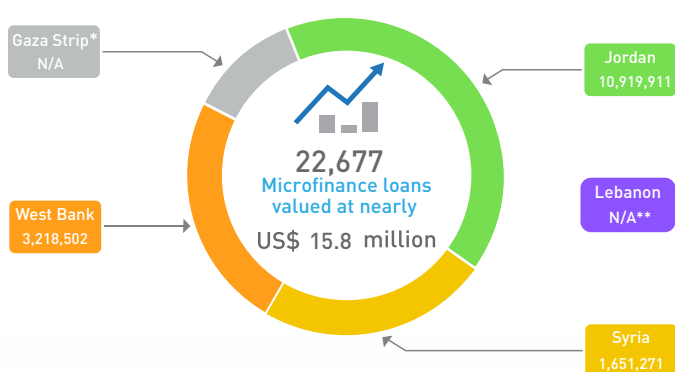
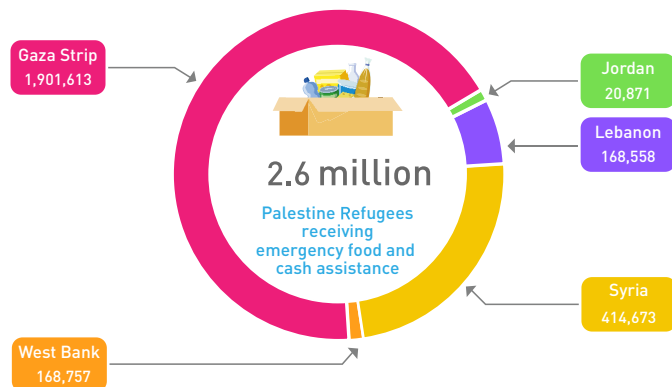
\*The number of primary health care facilities in the Gaza Strip varies, based on displacement orders. Before the war started in October 2023, UNRWA operated 22 health centres across the Gaza Strip.



\*The 2024 number of annual patient visits includes: 17,935 visits by Palestine Refugees from Syria (PRS) in Jordan and 94,185 visits by PRS in Lebanon.



\*Between 1 January 2023 and 30 September 2023, before the war started in October 2023, UNRWA had provided over 25,700 patients with antenatal care in the Gaza Strip.



\*Before the start of the war in October 2023, over 4,000 loans valued at over US\$ 4.5 million were issued in the Gaza Strip\*
